Rapid Immunization Skill Enhancement (RISE) is a complementary capacity building package to strengthen the ongoing training of frontline health workers engaged in routine immunization under Universal Immunization Program of Government of India. This user-centric model optimally leverages the high technology (mobile phone, internet) penetration among the health workforce and effectively uses a digital training content supported by a face-to-face component of mentoring by supervisors. The digital part is primarily self-learning through an objective focused content based on adult learning principles that engages the learners through a variety of audio, animated visuals, reading and interactions like learning games and quizzes. It also has a provision of objectively assessing the learning and certification to make it more attractive to the learners. An open source Learning Management System (LMS) has been custom made to manage and deliver this digital content and provide a real-time monitoring dashboard which enables problem-solving and mentoring by supervisors. The dashboard is the basis of this fortnightly bulletin on RISE update.

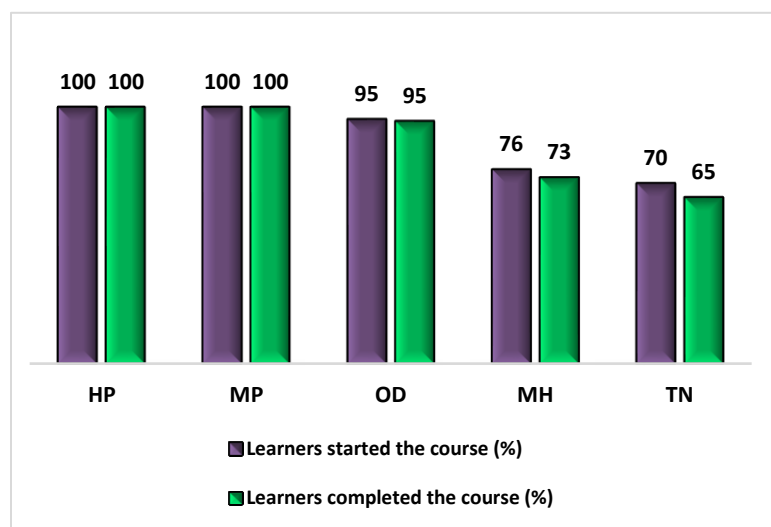
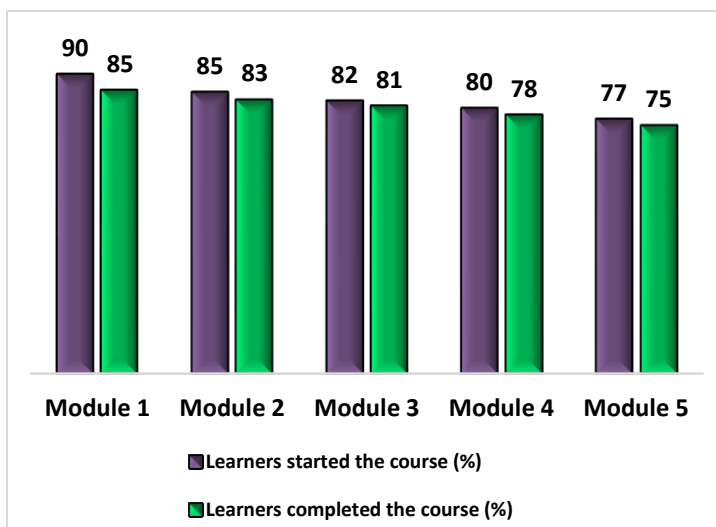

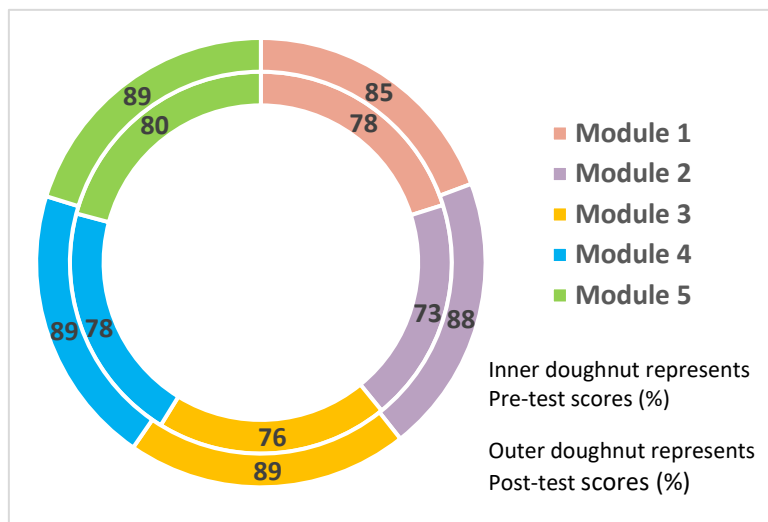
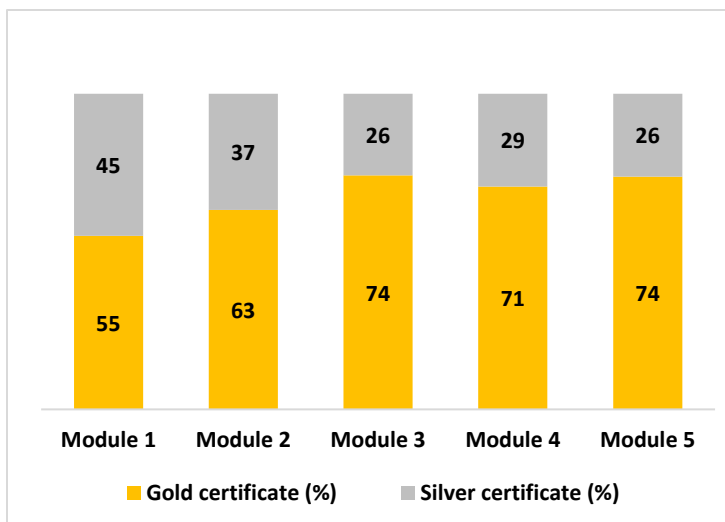

Mrs. Asha Devi is working as health supervisor in Sunni block in Shimla District. She had started her career as health worker in 1985 and got promoted as health supervisor in 2018. In her abundant experience of 35 years of service at different blocks of different districts, she has witnessed the changes in immunization programme over the past three decades. She has to carry out multiple responsibilities of cold chain management, supportive supervision of RI session, review and compile HMIS report, and also the added activities related COVID-19 such as supervision of quarantine persons and support health workers and ASHA workers and so on. She said that when RISE was started, they were apprehensive that it will be an additional workload. They thought it is like an online reporting which is done for many other programs. However, after taking the training course, their perception changed totally.

As she is not much tech-friendly, she was skeptical about the training course and therefore took almost 13 days to complete first module. However, gradually she gained confidence and found the operations of the app quite convenient. As a result, she completed the subsequent modules within 1 to 2 days only. Today, after completing all modules and current quizmaster she confidently says that **"RISE is the best place to know about new learnings related immunization."** She has also created a slogan for her peers that **"APNA RISE AYA HE, GYAN MOBILE ME LAYA HE"** (**Our RISE has come and brought knowledge in the mobile**). Now she is supporting her peer group during learning through WhatsApp and trying to refresh the knowledge of all health workers of the block. She believes that it will help in achieving 100 percent immunization coverage in her block.
