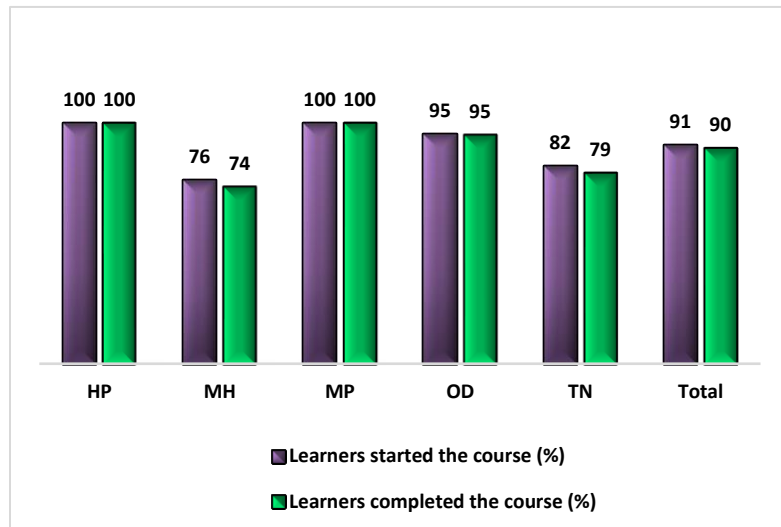
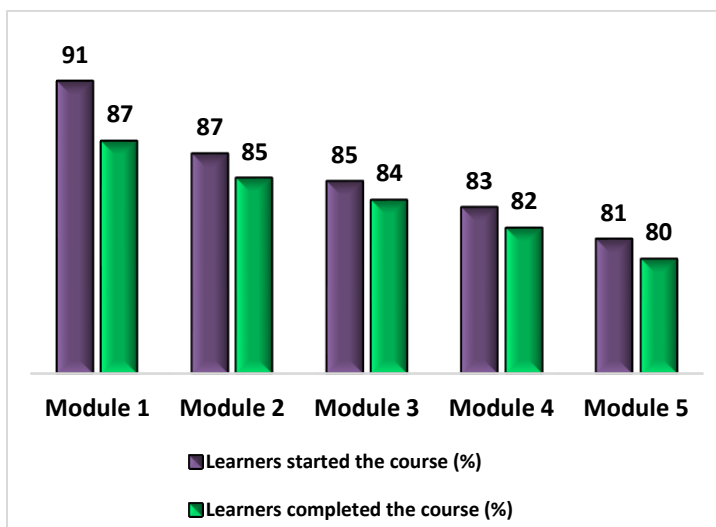
Rapid Immunization Skill Enhancement (RISE) is a complementary capacity building package to strengthen the ongoing training of frontline health workers engaged in routine immunization under Universal Immunization Program of Government of India. This user-centric model optimally leverages the high technology (mobile phone, internet) penetration among the health workforce and effectively uses a digital training content supported by a face-to-face component of mentoring by supervisors. The digital part is primarily self-learning through an objective focused content based on adult learning principles that engages the learners through a variety of audio, animated visuals, reading and interactions like learning games and quizzes. It also has a provision of objectively assessing the learning and certification to make it more attractive to the learners. An open source Learning Management System (LMS) has been custom made to manage and deliver this digital content and provide a real-time monitoring dashboard which enables problem-solving and mentoring by supervisors. The dashboard is the basis of the bulletin on RISE updates.

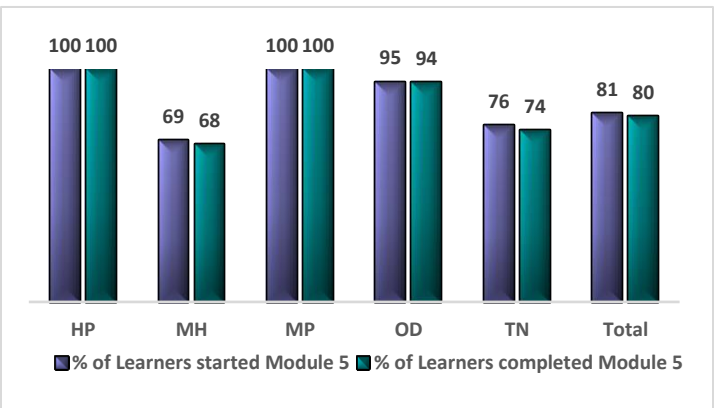
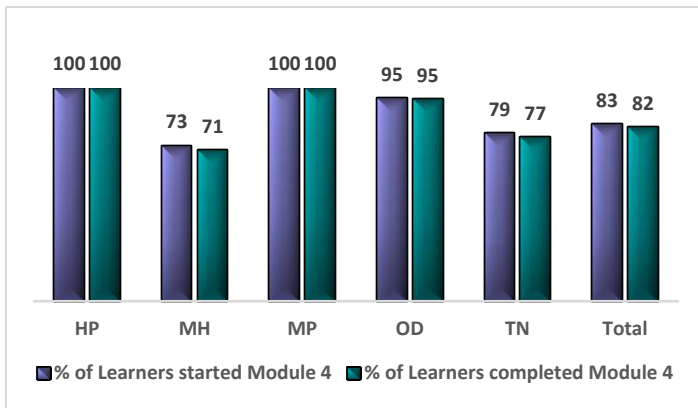
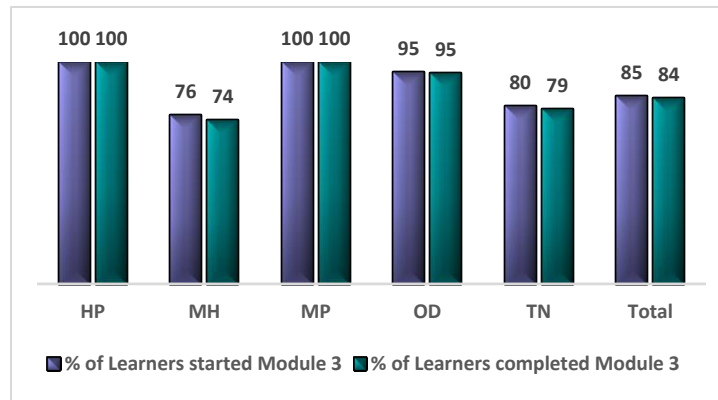
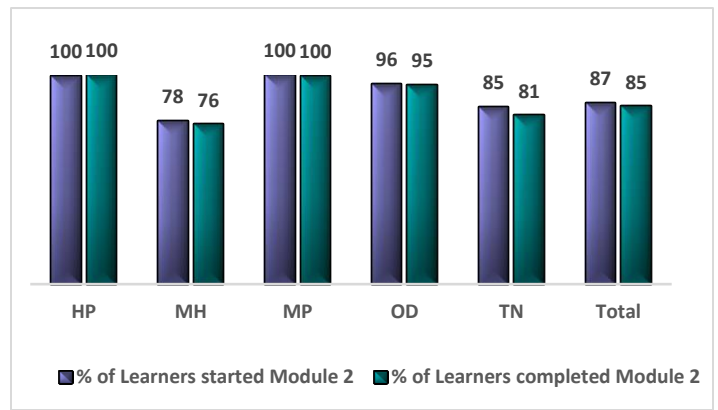
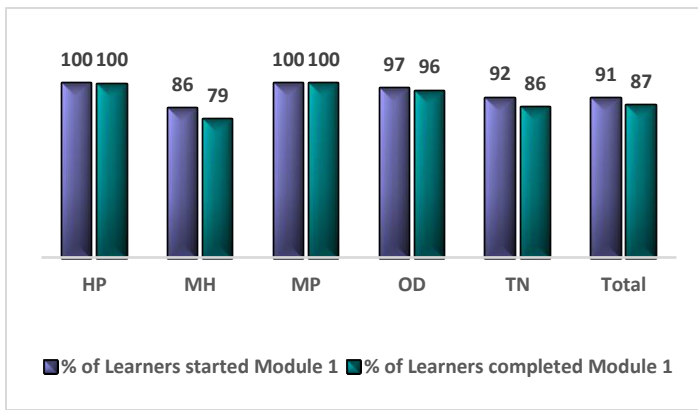

COVERAGE (average of 5 states)- Module-wise

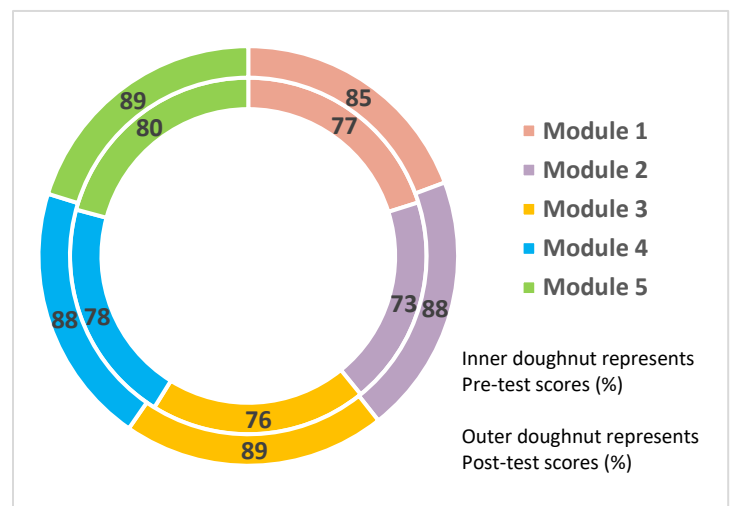
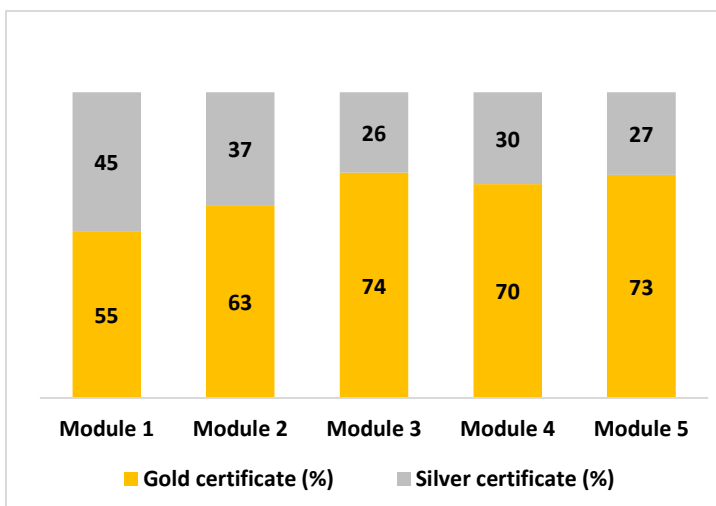
COVERAGE (average of 5 modules)- State-wise

## Highlights!!

**“Quizmaster”**: quizzes based on identified gaps in learning, assessed from the performance in the modules, is ongoing. This helps in continuity & consolidation of learning for the learners who have completed all the modules. Quiz 12 is being rolled out now after which the learners will be receiving the certificate of quiz completion.

**“Endline assessment”**: is going on in all the 5 states. Knowledge Assessment data has been collected in all the states except Madhya Pradesh (Ongoing in Indore). Practice assessment has been completed in Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra and Odisha and ongoing in Himachal Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh

## Story from Field

*“Jab se RISE aaya he, confidence hamara badhaya he”*

Mrs. Saroj Chauhan is posted in one of the challenging health subcenters of Kumarsain block of Shimla district. She has 23 years of work experience and has served the difficult terrains in many blocks of Shimla district. Though it is just 4 years to her retirement, yet her motivation and excitement to deliver health services to the remote population is commendable. She has completed all the RISE modules within 2-3 days of go live and has earned gold certificates in 4 out of the 5 modules. She faced regular network connectivity issues at her subcentre and her home, but even that did not deter her from completing the modules and she had worked on them at night when connectivity was better.”

With an elated expression, she says that **“jab se RISE aaya he, confidence hamara Badhaya he”** (Since RISE training has started, our confidence has increased).

She said that initially she was apprehensive whether she would be able to complete this online training at the age of 55 years. Also, the burden of COVID-19 activities made her worried. However, she felt confident and empowered after completing this amazing online training which, according to her, is very user friendly and need minimum hand-holding support.

She had prepared notes of all questions and answers which were part of RISE pre & post-test and the ongoing quizzes under Quizmaster. Before beginning her immunization session, she reads 10-20 questions regularly to update and refresh her knowledge. She has even started to show videos of RISE (for 10-15 minutes) to the ASHAs who work along with her and she feels that it has been helping to motivate ASHA's immunization related activities and improving their knowledge on immunization services eventually.

She said that **“Agar RISE module pura kerne me der ho jati thi to me so nahi pati thi.”** (I could not sleep if I was late in completing the modules of RISE).”

Mrs. Chauhan's enthusiasm and dedication has motivated her peers to also work on their knowledge and skills and improve the quality of immunization services. RISE has once again proved to be a great tool for peer to peer and collaborative learning for health workers.



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
